Who Are We?

Minority Recruitment and Retention Leadership Team (MRRLT)

The purpose of the Minority Recruitment and Retention Leadership Team (formerly called the Minority Recruitment Leadership Team or MRLT) is to provide coordinated leadership and direction for the university's efforts to increase the diversity of the student body.

MRRLT Measurement and Assessment Subcommittee

The Measurement and Assessment Subcommittee of the MRLT will provide support for the activities of the MRLT and all of its subcommittees by developing partnerships and sharing data among the groups that research and assess the recruitment and retention of African American/Black, Hispanic, and Regents' Scholar students. To this end, the Measurement and Assessment Subcommittee will identify common assessment needs, find appropriate ways to collaborate and streamline efforts of assessment groups, share existing data and ideas on how to address research needs, and continually ask the question: what do we need to know about these students in order to best meet the recruitment and success goals set by MRLT?
